INSTRUMENT OF GOVERNMENT: VOLUNTARY CONTROLLED SCHOOL

1. The name of the school is Barrow United Reformed Church Primary School
2. The school is a voluntary controlled school
3. The name of the governing body is "The Governing Body of Barrow United Reformed Church Primary School"
4. The ethos statement of this voluntary school is:

Recognising its historic foundation, the school will preserve and develop its religious character in accordance with the principles of the United Reformed Church and in partnership with the Church at local and synod level.

The school aims to serve its community by providing an education of the highest quality within the context of Christian belief and practice. It encourages an understanding of the meaning and significance of faith, and promotes Christian values through the experience it offers to all its pupils.

5. The governing body shall consist of:
 - (a) 5 co-opted governors
 - (b) 3 foundation governors
 - (c) 1 staff governor
 - (d) 1 headteacher
 - (e) 1 local authority governor
 - (f) 2 parent governors
6. The total number of governors is: 13
7. Those entitled to appoint foundation governors are:
 - (a) The United Reformed Church (North West Province) Trust Limited shall be entitled to appoint 2 Foundation Governors
8. (a) The holder of the following office shall be a foundation governor ex-officio:
 - a United Reformed Church minister serving the partnership in which the school is located
 - (b) The United Reformed Church (North West Province) shall appoint a foundation governor to act in the place of the ex-officio foundation governor whose governorship derives from the office named in (a) above, in the event that that ex-officio foundation governor is unable to or unwilling to act as a foundation governor, or there is a vacancy in the office by virtue of which the governorship exists.
9. The United Reformed Church (North West Province) Trust Limited shall have the power to request the

removal of the ex-officio foundation governor and to appoint any substitute

10. This instrument of government comes into effect on 1 September 2019
11. This instrument was made by order of Lancashire local authority on 23 July 2019
12. A copy of the instrument must be supplied to every member of the governing body (and the headteacher if not a governor), and to trustees and all bodies which appoint foundation governors
