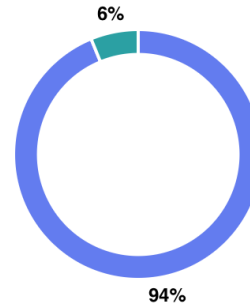

The indoor environment at school helps my child feel safe, calm and supported in their wellbeing (0 point)

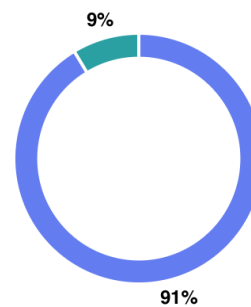

The school's outdoor environment is used effectively to support my child's wellbeing. (0 point)

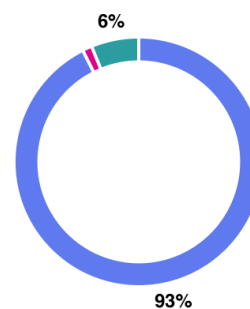

Daily routines at school help my child feel secure, settled and ready to learn. (0 point)

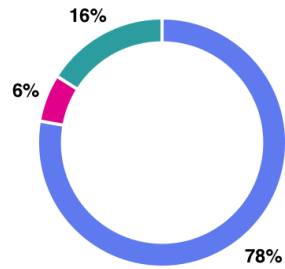

Transitions and changes at school are managed well and are a positive experience for my child. (0 point)

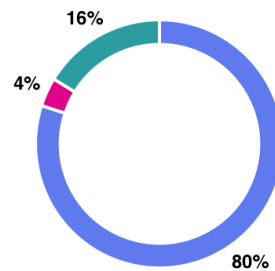

My child has positive, supportive relationships with staff and peers at school. (0 point)

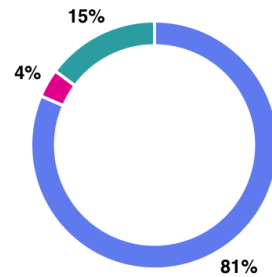

The school supports me to understand and value the importance of wellbeing for my child and our family. (0 point)

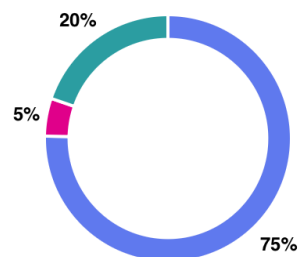

My child's emotional wellbeing is understood by staff and supported as part of their learning and development. (0 point)

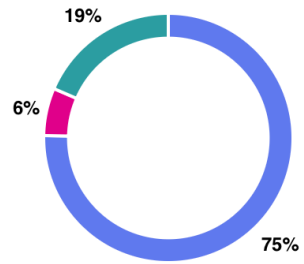
